Agency	Program Name	Description of Program
La Familia	Project REAL: Responsibility, Experience, Attitude & Learning \$48,000	Provides case management, home visitation, workforce readiness and anger management to help participants avoid entrenchment in gang lifestyle.
Boys and Girls Club	Great Futures: Triple Play Sports League \$40,000	Free organized sports league comprised of basketball, soccer and dodgeball. Youth develop life skills in a safe and supportive Club environment.
The Hawk Institute	Leadership Academy \$38,000	Leadership Academy for at-risk young men of color and underserved male students. Provides college and career support as well as opportunities for community involvement and student leadership.
Latino Leadership Council	Proyecto de Familias \$35,000	Provides Spanish-language family support services and home visits by bilingual / bicultural <i>promotores</i> who can help families access community-based services and resources.
South Sacramento Christian Center	Community Night Walks \$25,000	Provides training, recruitment and support for night walk activities, directing high-risk youth to resources and empowering the community to take a stance against gang violence.
Campus Life Crossover	Crossover Life Skills & Recreation \$35,000	Provides an after-school life skills and recreation program with culturally competent adult mentors to help at-risk young people with the development of character, confidence and responsibility.
East Bay Asian Youth Center (EBAYC)	Juvenile Justice Case Management \$38,000	Provides culturally and linguistically-responsive one-to-one life skills mentoring and counseling services, personalized to each youth's needs and strengths.
Robert's Family Development Center	North Sacramento Community Coalition \$25,000	Responds to the needs of the community by strengthening relationships and increasing community ownership in order to create safety networks and give residents access to resources.
Sacramento Area Youth Speaks (SAYS)	Esperanza Services \$60,000	Connects high-risk youth to higher education by using spoken word performance poetry as a teaching tool to increase student engagement and build critical literacy skills.
Musical Instruments N Kids Hands (MINKH)	Mobile Music Program \$26,000	Connects youth with professional music producers. Students will develop effective life skills, increase their knowledge of commercial music, and complete a digital musical recording project.

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Shoulder to Shoulder	Mentoring for Urban Fatherless Youth \$30,000	Links positive male role models with urban fatherless boys, starting in 4th grade, alongside single mothers and grandmothers raising them, challenging our young men to take responsibility for their lives.
National Academic Youth Corp	Y-Corp Entrepreneur Program \$45,000	Participants will be immersed in business acumen training. Teams of young entrepreneurs will plan and market their own small enterprise.
Reading Partners	One on One Reading Tutoring \$45,000	Supports low-income students to achieve reading proficiency through curriculum driven, one-on-one volunteer tutoring. Tutor relationships foster self-confidence and belief that education matters.
Fresh Producers	Well Fed Fresher Sacramento \$40,000	A leadership and entrepreneurial program that develops workforce skills and economic empowerment. Trains teens and adults as Fresher Chefs for a “community meal plan”
Always Knocking	Street Outreach/ Crisis Response \$30,000	Provides outreach for various hot spots and referrals to needed services. Crisis Team will monitor tension and respond to incidents.
G.A.P. Gang Awareness & Prevention	Inside-Out \$30,000	Foster relationships with incarcerated youth and provide mentoring and wrap around services when they exit juvenile hall in order to reduce recidivism.
Health Education Council	SHOP Project: Safety, Health, Opportunities & Prevention \$60,000	Community engagement activities to impart life skills, foster cognitive development, facilitate family support to build youth capacity to positively respond to conflict.
Focus on Family	Visual and Performing Arts Academy \$30,000	Arts focused program promoting cultural awareness, sense of efficacy, and social and emotional development.
