Local Rapid Re-Housing & Employment	SSF <i>(subcontract to VOA)</i>	\$500,000	Annual	In partnership with County & Sutter, 100+ households provided short term rent assistance, case management & employment assistance. Additional \$855,000 from County and \$500,000 from Sutter.
Winter Motel Vouchers	SSF <i>(subcontract to TBD)</i>	\$100,000	Annual	~15 motel rooms from Thanksgiving – April for those unable to access Winter Sanctuary (e.g. frail, elderly, etc.)
Comprehensive Alcohol Treatment Center (CATC/Detox)	VOA	\$708,351	Annual	80 beds for homeless, serial inebriate men and women identified by law enforcement, social detox support and links to housing & case management
A Street Men's Shelter	VOA	\$177,500	Annual	City & Sutter funding added to existing funding to allow 80 beds for single men to remain open 24/7, allowing additional access to services and housing and reducing the length of time homeless
Center of Hope Emergency Shelter	The Salvation Army	\$255,500	Annual	City & Sutter funding added to existing funding to allow 132 beds for single men & women to remain open 24/7, allowing additional access to services & housing and reducing the length of time homeless
Saint John's Program for Real Change	Saint John's	\$600,000	One time <i>(FY 2015/16)</i>	Capital improvements to add 30 units to existing program, serving up to 90 additional women & children
Pit Stop	FAS/City	\$100,000	One time <i>(FY 2015/16)</i>	6-month pilot of a clean/safe restroom for homeless in the River District with a goal of cleaner streets for businesses in area.
Mobile Veterinarian	City	\$50,000	One time <i>(FY 2015/16)</i>	City funding supplies to support volunteer veterinarian offering services for pets of the homeless, leading to increased outreach opportunities. Program in partnership with SPD and Front Street Animal Shelter.
Pay for Success	Social Finance <i>(consultant)</i>	\$25,000	One time <i>(FY 2016/17)</i>	Feasibility study for using Pay For Success financing to create housing for homeless. Additional \$25,000 from County and \$120,000 from Sutter.
