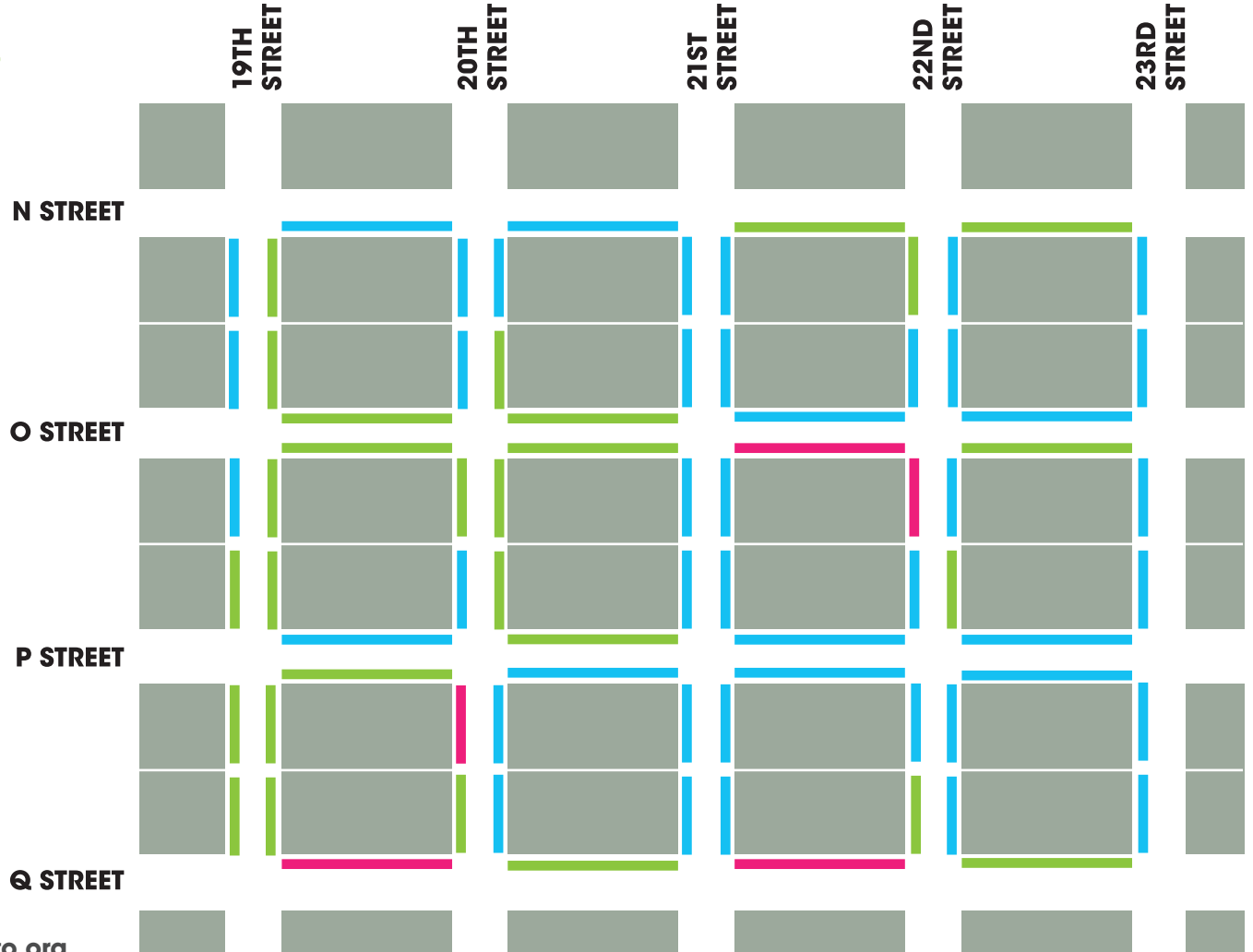

Parking Access Pilot Project

Your neighborhood has been picked to pilot new parking restrictions for city services starting on October 24th, 2016.

City services include:

- Weekly garbage collection
- Weekly containerized yard waste collection
- Every-other-week recycling collection
- Weekly on-street leaf season collection (Nov-Dec-Jan)
- Monthly street sweeping

The pilot area is 19th to 23rd streets, and N to Q streets and will run for six months.

The city wants to match the parking access on your block with the level of service that is provided.

The map on the reverse shows the changes being made for the pilot.

- Streets with no changes to restrictions.
- Streets with weekly restrictions that will now have monthly restrictions.
- Streets with no restrictions, that will now have once-a-month parking restrictions.

Residents who use weekly curbside collection for their garbage, recycle and yard waste will have no changes on their block.

Why the changes?

The city recognizes that servicing a vibrant, mixed-use area requires a balance between access for services and available parking. By tailoring the restrictions block by block The Recycling and Solid Waste Division believes it can provide better service to our customers, with less parking restrictions.

What does street cleaning really mean?

Street cleaning is a term used for all the services the city provides. But most residents and visitors think it only refers to street sweeping. As signs are replaced, the term “city services” will replace “street cleaning” for clarity.
