

## SACRAMENTO FIRE DEPARTMENT YOUTH PROGRAMS



### SACRAMENTO AREA GIRLS FIRE CAMP

This camp gives young women a chance to experience what a career in the fire service entails. The campers work side by side with professional women firefighters in empowering leadership roles, while participating in fire service-related team work and skill rotations. The camp is currently held once per year on Saturday/Sunday from 08:00-17:00. Up to 50 high school students can attend the program. Women from fire departments throughout the region come together to support and deliver this valuable program! The next camp dates are TBD – late spring/early summer 2019.



### SACRAMENTO REGIONAL FIREFIGHTER YOUTH ACADEMY

- Firefighter Youth Academy is a 9-month long youth development and career exploration program that benefits high school aged students who are at-risk of academic, social and/or economic failure. Firefighters and other positive role models serve as mentors to promote the fundamental program principles: Academic Achievement, Community Service, and Self-Discipline. The next Academy begins in April -December 2019 and is held every Saturday from 0800-1300. Up to 60 cadets will be accepted into the program.
- We are exploring options to partner with recipients of the WIOA In-School grants to be a WEX provider for qualified students who will become seniors in the fall

# Youth Programming



## City of Sacramento YOUTH EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

The City of Sacramento's youth vocational training and employment programs provide young people with experiences and supports that foster their development as healthy, productive adults. Early adult outcomes include education, economic self-sufficiency, healthy family and social relationships, and positive contributions to the community. Youth are supported in this development through five fundamental pathways: safety, healthy relationships, engagement, connecting to community, and relevant skill building.

Through these programs, youth practice newly acquired skills in safe, supportive environments. Adults provide mentoring as youth learn to successfully navigate school, work, community, and life's day-to-day challenges and choices.

**WORKFORCE INNOVATION & OPPORTUNITY ACT (WIOA)** – A strengths-based, paid work experience program, for high school seniors. WIOA partners with local government, private business and the retail industry. Participants with specific barriers (ex: pregnant and/or parenting, foster youth, homeless) receive training in pre-employment skills such as resume writing, employer expectations, service learning, and navigating college campuses. The WIOA program works closely with schools and provides supportive services to students in need. Supportive services may include transportation assistance, tutoring, and counseling center referrals. **Applications available at the Belle Coolidge Community Center – 5699 S. Land Park Drive.**

**LANDSCAPE & LEARNING (L&L)** - Youth ages 14-17 years who reside within the city limits of Sacramento receive paid work experience providing landscape maintenance and general clean-up in our city parks. All youth participating in this program receive specialized training in landscaping, employer expectations, teamwork, safety, customer service, and time management. **This is a highly competitive youth employment program. Information for next recruitment (Summer 2019) will be available in March 2019. Applications will be available at the Belle Coolidge Community Center – 5699 S. Land Park Drive.**

**PRIME TIME TEEN** – A fun, interactive work readiness training program for young people between the ages of 13-17. Participants gain skills in job searching, resume development, completing job applications, interviewing, financial literacy, communication, leadership, teamwork, problem-solving, and community service. All participants who meet attendance goals and participate in a youth-led community service project will receive a \$300 stipend. (Participants must have a signed copy of their social security card on file to receive stipend). Program is free. Spaces are limited. Registration opens one month prior to the program start date.


