The Time Has Arrived. Get your 2005 (Registration sticker, that is).

The 2003 California Vessel Registration stickers expired on December 31, 2003. The current two-year registration period covers January 1, 2004 to December 31, 2005. California Law requires most vessels to be registered through the Department of Motor Vehicles and for current stickers to be posted on a vessel's bow. The cost is only \$10. An application can be completed by mail, in person or online at: <http://www.dmv.ca.gov/forms.formsboat.htm>.

A copy of the current registration must be kept on board your boat whenever it is used on the water. The registration (CF) numbers must be painted on or permanently attached to each side of the forward part of the vessel. The CFs must be plain vertical block characters at least three inches high, of a contrasting color to the hull, and be arranged to read from left to right.

Dinghies propelled solely by oars or paddles and sailing vessels eight feet long or less, are not required to be registered. For more information from the DMV about registering your vessel, go to: <http://www.dmv.ca.gov/boatsinfo/boat.htm>.

REMINDER: Berth Fee Increases

Berth Rental fees are scheduled to increase on July 1, 2004. More information will be mailed in June with your new payment coupons.

Rent Payments & Late Fees

In the past, we allowed rent to be paid on the Monday after the 10th if the 10th fell on a Saturday or Sunday. This was when we were not open on the weekends. Since we have been consistently open on weekends for approximately 1 year and we have a night drop box that is accessible 24hrs a day, we have no longer been giving the extra day or two grace period.

Our policy is that the rent is due on the 1st of each month. However, we offer a 10 day grace period before charging a late fee. If your rent payment is not in the office by 4:00pm on the 10th, your rent is late and a 10% late fee will be applied to your account.

We also offer as a convenience a pay by phone service. You may call us and pay over the phone using a credit card.

If you have any questions or comments regarding this policy, please contact the marina office. We will be glad to discuss it with you.

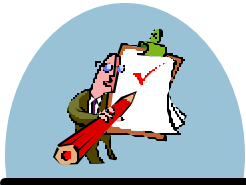
West Coast Brew Fest 2004 in Miller Park

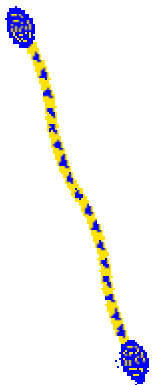

Fuel Dock Safety

Now that we are getting into the boating season there will be a lot more traffic at the fuel dock and in the South Basin of the Marina. Please be courteous to your fellow boaters when traveling through this area.

Remember...

- Turn off all electrical appliances and equipment on your boat while at the fuel dock. This includes, but is not limited to, radios, blowers, TV's, generators, etc. Anything that can cause a spark.
- Close all hatches on boat.
- Know how much your fuel tank can hold. If you put more in than your tank can hold, you could have a leak.
- Take your time while docking. It is better to take it slow and easy while docking than come in too fast and cause damage to either your boat, the pumps or a person.
- And most important...**no open flames!** This means no smoking of any kind or barbecues.

Common Sense Rules of the River...Stay Safe on the Water!

- Boats must be at least 200 feet away from ANY boat dock or ramp when driving over 5 MPH.
- Always put children in life jackets.
- Always travel at a safe speed and be aware of other boats in front of and behind you.
- Please keep your stereo volume down as a courtesy to other boaters and homeowners along the river.
- Have fun...be safe!

Safety and Survival Tips...Operator's Responsibilities

Your water fun depends on you, your equipment and other people who, like yourself, enjoy spending leisure time on, in or near the water. Let's take a look at a few of your responsibilities...

- Make sure the boat is in top operating condition and that there are no tripping hazards. The boat should be free of fire hazards and have clean bilges.
- Safety equipment, required by law, is on board, maintained in good condition, and you know how to properly use these devices.
- Have a complete knowledge of the operation and handling characteristics of your boat.
- Know and practice the Rules of the Road (Navigation Rules).
- Maintain a safe speed at all times to avoid collision.

You are the key to water safety!
