Elementary Students Join in Recycling and Conservation Fair at Solid Waste Facility

Local students will enjoy a field trip to see where their trash and recyclables go after the garbage truck picks up their container. They will also be attending an educational fair and exhibits displaying what can be done with recycled products.

Why: Each year, the City of Sacramento Department of Utilities Solid Waste Services, in partnership with the Sacramento Recycling and Transfer Station sponsors the Recycling and Conservation Fair and invites local elementary students. The focus of the Recycling and Conservation Fair is to teach students more about preserving the environment and how they can help reduce the City of Sacramento's trash disposal by recycling. The highlight of the Fair is a tour of the Recycling and Transfer Station that allows students to see how much waste is generated, how it is handled, and how they can help preserve the environment and enhance the livability and sustainability of Sacramento by recycling.
