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FROM THE PRESERVATION DIRECTOR

Two things of note...
First, to mark your calendars for the *Thursday, June 16th, 31st Annual Sacramento Old City Association's Architectural Awards* – to be held at 718 K Street and featuring guest speaker William Fulton, speaking on urban planning, metropolitan growth and economic development. Second, on August 22nd the City's Development Services Department is launching its' new **MATRIX** program, to organize the permit process more efficiently, with some projects already being tested in the program. The program will begin as a pilot program for development project proposals within the Central City – Downtown and Midtown – and East Sacramento. **Bill Thomas**, Development Service's Operations Chief, will head up the program and work to get everyone needed to approve a project on the team, from planning and environmental, to building, fire, utilities, engineering, and any one else needed.
