



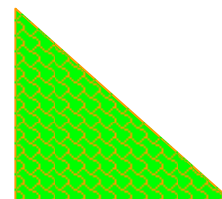
HOW TO MAKE A DOG BANDANA

Dog bandanas are fabric triangles that are worn by dogs in the Adoption Building at the shelter and at offsite adoption events. They are used to dress up the animals to help them get adopted. Any leftover fabric can be used, or you can cut up an article of clothing. The best bandanas are colorful or have a holiday theme, are sturdy, and are washable.

You can help the animals that are cared for by City Animal Care Services by making these bandanas in your home and donating them to Animal Care. Dog Bandanas can be used to fulfill community service requirements, as a youth group project, or as a personal project!

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut pieces of fabric into approximately 22" by 22" squares.
2. Fold in half diagonally and cut along the fold.
3. Hem ½" along all three sides.



Variations:

Squares can range in sizes from 11" by 11" to 28" by 28". The 22" size fits most dogs.

Completed dog bandanas or donations of fabric or thread can be dropped off at our Main Lobby
