**STAFF REPORTS:**

8. SUSTAINABILITY MASTER PLAN

Staff reviewed the item including the Department of Parks and Recreation's role, the City of Sacramento's approach and next steps, and phased implementation plan. Commissioners

discussed specific efforts including baseline pesticide use, removal of leaf waste which causes need to replace with mulch, recycling, and public education.

9. 2030 GENERAL PLAN – PREFERRED LAND USE ALTERNATIVE

Commissioners discussed integration of bike trails, public transportation plans, traffic congestion considerations, housing mix strategies, and sustainability. The City's Long Range Planning staff will incorporate the Commissioner's comments into this phase of development of the General Plan.

10. GEORGE SIM COMMUNITY CENTER EXPANSION UPDATE

Dave Morgan with the City's General Services Department reviewed the status of the project which is on a fast track and is to break ground in Spring 2008. Commissioners and staff discussed sustainability measures in the design of the Center, water and plant use for surrounding areas, and storm water management.

11. CITY OF SACRAMENTO'S PROPOSED FY 2007/08 OPERATING AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BUDGETS AND TENTATIVE COUNCIL HEARING SCHEDULE

Staff reviewed the City Manager's proposed Fiscal Year 2007/08 budget, which was released on May 1, 2007. The Parks and Recreation Department's sections of the proposed budget were distributed at the meeting. Staff and Commissioners discussed the use of various funding sources for capital improvements and planning and public outreach for specific park development projects.

**DIRECTOR'S UPDATE**

Cassandra Jennings, Assistant City Manager and Interim Parks and Recreation Director, stated there will be a temporary snack facility in McClatchy Park this year in response to requests for assistance from youth sports league groups. The Commission's Planning and Communication Workshop will continue at next regular meeting on June 7<sup>th</sup>. The Commission Chair may want to start the meeting earlier to allow sufficient time for the workshop.

**COMMISSIONERS' IDEAS, QUESTIONS & ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Commissioner Tamayo distributed a local publication entitled *River Friendly Landscape Guidelines* and requested an opportunity for the Commission and staff to learn more about the principles covered in the document and their direct application to Parks and Recreation.
