3. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF OCTOBER 2005 DRAFT MEETING MINUTES

The October 13, 2005 meeting minutes were approved with the following addition under COMMISSIONER'S IDEAS, QUESTIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS (in italics): Commissioner Tamayo suggested staff refrain from recommending application of sprays or pesticides to members of the public *due to potential liability and problems with pesticide regulations*, and that *City* staff be more proactive in planning for cell tower sites.

4. PUBLIC TESTIMONY FOR MATTERS NOT ON THE AGENDA

Several residents from the McKinley Park neighborhood were present to state the following concerns regarding the park: the overall condition of the park has declined; City staff, park users and landscape contractors are driving and parking on the turf, causing ruts and broken sprinkler heads; vehicles are parked on the jogging path also causing ruts and uneven surfaces which can cause injury to joggers; broken heads and ruts lead to standing water; the restrooms are open 24/7 and thus subject to vandalism and filth; sod was installed in a shaded area at the new picnic area and failed within a month, bringing into question if the landscape contractor guaranteed the job; weeds with stickers are proliferating in the turf; tree maintenance is lacking; the number of inebriates is increasing; graffiti is increasing; lighting needs to extend around the tennis courts; pesticide use on the perimeter of the park may harm wildlife, and the sufficiency of food for ducks and geese in the pond over the winter months was questioned.

Commissioners made recommendations including calling City Park Safety Services at 825-3562 to report incidents as they occur. Bob Overstreet, Parks and Recreation Director, will have Department staff coordinate an on-site meeting with those present and appropriate City staff to discuss these issues, and report back to the Commission.

Mr. Bill Grant stated concerns about programming decisions at the Hart Senior Center, and questioned the adequacy of promotion of activities such as Bingo. A citizen at the meeting commented on the age, education and training of Recreation staff who work with Triple R Program participants.

**STAFF REPORTS:**

10. SOUTHSIDE PARK POND UPDATE

Staff updated the Commission on current and long-term plans and activities to achieve an environmentally safe and long-term solution to managing the health and clarity of South Park Pond.

Commissioners suggested that staff post information on-site about plans and activities; retain a consultant to analyze the water for algae, bacteria and nutrients and make recommendations; develop a monitoring plan including data on water quality, etc.; monitor the effect of these activities on waterfowl; develop an educational/interpretive effort at the pond for public information and benefit, engage the neighborhood in monitoring the pond, and apply to the City's Utilities Department for water quality management grants.

Residents from the Southside Park neighborhood stated they appreciated the natural approach and efforts to improve the pond, would like to establish an agreed-upon water quality level, and would like to stay involved.

11. EXPANDED VISION FOR SUTTER'S LANDING REGIONAL PARK

Following staff's presentation, Mary Healy, Sacramento Zoo Director, and Terry Kastanis, Sacramento Zoological Society Board Member, discussed the long-range vision to develop a regional zoo at the park. Commissioners discussed with staff and Mr. Kastanis environmental concerns and future review and regulatory processes to ensure public health and safety; the park's centralized location along the river and the potential to purchase surrounding properties to expand the park; revenue needs, and various recreation elements.

Motion approved to support an expanded vision for Sutter's Landing Regional Park to include regional destination attractions to be reflected in a future formal update of the Parks' Master Plan, with the addition of the following statement to the *Vision for Sutter's Landing Park* (Attachment B in the agenda packet): Retain, or replace of equal size, an onsite covered skatepark as a regional destination.


