

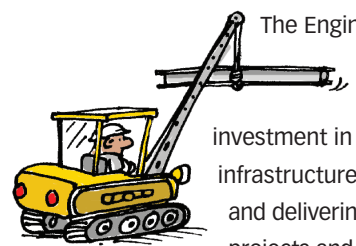


Our Work

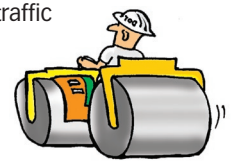
Our 400 employees proudly serve 500,000 citizens in a rapidly growing metropolitan region of 1.5 million people. Our annual operating budget exceeds \$60 million.

The Department of Transportation includes four specialized divisions: Engineering Services, Parking Services, Street Services and Urban Forestry, all supported by the Office of the Director.

Engineering Services



The Engineering Services division focuses on managing the City's investment in new transportation infrastructure. By planning, funding and delivering capital improvement projects and traffic operation services, the division improves safety and usability for pedestrians, bicyclists and vehicle traffic on City streets.



Engineering Services delivers road and bridge improvement projects, and provides planning, design, inspection, survey and traffic management services.

Street Services

Street Services maintains and repairs thousands of miles of City roads, curbs, gutters and sidewalks as well as maintains and repairs streetlights, signalized intersections, traffic signs and acres of landscaped medians and right-of-way throughout the City.



Street Services handles pavement and concrete maintenance, installation of accessible curb ramps, traffic signs, road markings, traffic signal installations and operation, street light installation and streetscape maintenance.

Office of the Director



The Office of the Director provides department-wide support, in policy and planning, information systems, budgeting and finance, public outreach and media relations, organizational development, human resources and employee enrichment activities to DOT employees.

Additionally, the Planning and Policy staff develops and recommends strategic initiatives and citywide and regional transportation policies, as well as long-range planning of the City's multi-modal transportation system.

Urban Forestry



With about 120,000 trees along streets, in parks, golf courses and at City facilities, Urban Forestry is responsible for removal of damaged or otherwise unsafe trees, structural pruning, tree plantings and replacements, emergency responses and other requests. The division also partners with organizations such as the Sacramento Tree Foundation and Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) on tree installations, as well as a variety of civic organizations and local corporations.

Urban Forestry takes care of tree trimming and removal (including stump removal and palm maintenance), tree planting and maintenance, and scientific and technical services (including public outreach and community relations).



Programs include a mistletoe eradication program that allows citizens to borrow tools or take advantage of low-cost pruning or removal of infested trees, and a "save the elms" program that organizes volunteers to monitor trees to stop the spread of Dutch elm disease.

Parking Services

The Parking Services division manages parking in the interest of businesses and residents City-wide. Through the utilization of new technologies, the introduction of pilot programs and the management of capital improvement projects, the division continues to increase its ability to meet the challenges and responsibilities of Sacramento's growing parking demand.



The Parking Services division oversees capital improvement projects, property management of parking garages, surface lots and retail space and collection of all parking revenues from parking enforcement and meters.

The division manages more than 65,000 square feet of retail space, 8,500 off-street parking spaces, 5,300 metered spaces and 19 residential parking permit zones encompassing more than 25,000 parking spaces.
