City to start critical repairs and improvements on six heavily traveled roadways

The City streets most in need of repair will be extensively resurfaced beginning the first week of September through mid October. The six arterials or collectors are scheduled to receive an “overlay,” which is the most comprehensive road resurfacing treatment, just short of complete reconstruction. The City’s share of state gas tax dollars and other state funds along with federal dollars pay for this year’s \$3.4 million in overlays of the following roadways:

- 2nd Avenue from Stockton Boulevard to Santa Cruz Way
- Truxel Road from West El Camino Avenue to San Juan Road
- Pocket Road from Greenhaven Drive to Interstate 5
- La Mancha Way from Mack Road to Tangerine Avenue
- 12th Street from N Street to P Street
- 13th Street from N Street to P Street

Properly maintained, an overlay can extend the life of the street by 20 to 25 years, although heavily used streets may require more frequent overlays.

Overlays, continued

What businesses and residents can expect:

- Work will be done on weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 4 p.m., with the exception of 12th and 13th streets, where work will be done on weekends, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. to minimize traffic congestion.
- On La Mancha Way, a segment of the street will be completely closed to through traffic for five consecutive days during construction. Access to driveways will be provided.
- In all cases except La Mancha Way, one lane in each direction should be open at all times.
- Residents will be notified via a reminder that will be hung on the door three to five days before the street is due to be resurfaced specifying the day work is to be done. Note, before and after the actual resurfacing, work crews may be seen performing other work on the street.
