Dear Storefront Dispensary Owner :

It has come to our attention that the Department of Cannabis Control (DCC) is continuing to issue storefront dispensaries with authorizations for curbside pickup as part of its emergency relief authority. As you know, the State's authorization requires the approval of the local jurisdiction to offer this service.

The Office of Cannabis Management (OCM) has allowed this service since March 2020 by exercising our discretion to not enforce our Code on a limited, emergency basis under the authority of Sacramento the Covid Public Health Order issued by Sacramento County. However, the Public Health Order has been rescinded as of February 16, 2022, and unfortunately, we no longer have the basis to continue allowing this service.

In this regard, OCM is no longer issuing authorization letters to supplement DCC's emergency relief. If you are still offering curbside pickup service to your customers, please terminate the service as soon as possible. Also, as please be advised that we will begin enforcing the City's land use and cannabis codes (Sacramento City Code Ch. 17.228.920.E.1 and Ch. 5.150.370), which prohibits curbside pickup service effective immediately.

Curbside pickup is proposed to be a permanent service under the DCC's proposed regulations. But just like the curbside pickup allowed under the State's emergency relief authority, local approval will still be required. However, until the City's Codes are amended to allow curbside pickup, we are unable to provide such approval.
