Is Your Vehicle Ready to Travel?

Brakes

Schedule regular maintenance and look for warning signs. Be Alert.



Lights

Make sure you headlights, brake lights, turn signals, emergency lights, and interior lights work properly.



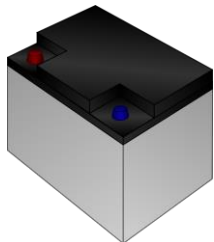
Fluid Levels

Check Oil, brake, transmission, power steering, coolant, and windshield washer fluid levels.



Tires

Regularly check and maintain. Ensure you have proper air pressure (check once a month) & tire tread depth. Maintain spare tire as well.



Battery

Test and replace if needed (every 3-5 years)



Emergency Supplies

Jumper cables, first aid kit, flashlight and extra batteries, tool kit, water, non-perishable foods (such as energy bars, dry cereal, crackers) blankets, warm clothes, flares, cell phone and charger.
