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HOLIDAY SEASON MORATORIUM FOR CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

In an effort to reduce traffic congestion during the holiday season, the City of Sacramento restricts construction on City streets during a holiday season moratorium period. Unless specifically approved by the City Traffic Engineer, all construction and maintenance projects on the attached list of streets shall be terminated during the holiday season. The holiday season begins on Thanksgiving Day and ends on January 2nd.

Unless otherwise approved, no street or sidewalk work, cuts, or trenching will be allowed during this period on the listed streets, and all existing street work shall be back filled and paved. All barricades and barriers shall be removed from all travel lanes.

Emergency repairs will be permitted during this holiday period; however, all such repairs shall be reported to the Construction Services Office, 915 I Street, Room 2000, Sacramento, CA 95814, telephone (916) 808-6810, within one hour of the determined need. If an emergency arises during the City's non-working hours, notification to the above office shall be made before 9:00 a.m. of the following work day.

Those requesting to work during the holiday moratorium must submit a formal request in writing to the Construction Services Office prior to the moratorium. Requests should be submitted as soon as possible so that cumulative impacts of projects can be assessed. The request must include a traffic control plan that describes location, work proposed, work times, and public right-of-way required. Attached is a sample request form that may be submitted.

Each location will be reviewed on an individual basis for need and for the effect on traffic.

Request to Work in City Right-of-Way During the Holiday Moratorium

Contractors whose work may infringe on public right-of-way or impact vehicular or pedestrian traffic during the holiday moratorium are **required to submit this completed form and three (3) copies of a traffic control plan** with the form. This form may also be attached to the respective Encroachment Permit Application Package. No work shall be performed until said traffic control plan has been approved.

The traffic control plan shall be neat, legible, and at a minimum meet the requirements of the Work Area Traffic Control Handbook (WATCH) 2001 Ninth Edition. In addition to vehicular traffic control, the plan shall address pedestrian impacts and appropriate pedestrian traffic control measures. This plan shall include the detailed location of all proposed construction area traffic control devices necessary to perform the proposed work, all proposed phases of the traffic control plan, the specific times requested to have the traffic control plan in effect, and clearly delineate what public right-of-way is being impacted.

The Director or designee may revoke or require the plan to be modified at any time.

The contractor shall conform to the requirements of the approved traffic control plan.

The approved plan must be available for inspection by the Director or designee at the work site at all times.
